Perpetual funds international philanthropy scholarships for FIA

The Fundraising Institute Australia today announced it has received \$20,000 from The Perpetual Foundation to assist with professional development within the charitable sector.

"The grant from The Perpetual Foundation will assist us to fulfil our mission through awarding two international scholarships for professional development," Ms McMillan said.

Andrew Thomas, Perpetual's General Manager Philanthropy, said the scholarships are in line with the key objectives of The Perpetual Foundation.

"The Perpetual Foundation focuses on the improved leadership, management and governance of non-profit organisations and their capacity to achieve sustainability for the long-term benefit of society," Mr Thomas said.

"The FIA scholarships will allow two individuals to learn from international experts and apply that learning to the Australian community."

Scholarship details will be announced in September, and the winning recipients will be presented with their scholarships at the FIA's International Conference 2011 in Melbourne in February next year.
