

Sue-Anne Wallace AM FIACD

Dr Sue-Anne Wallace has worked in the not-for-profit sector almost her entire professional career, in hospitals, universities, museums and peak bodies, with a focus during the past 14 years on fundraising, self-regulation and governance.

As CEO of FIA (2004-2009) she developed the Principles and Standards of Fundraising Practice to raise the practice of charitable fundraising in Australia. During this period, she engaged with federal and state governments on the regulation of charities, fundraising reform and cutting red tape, and held a number of positions concerned with self-regulation of charities. She has written extensively for *Fundraising & Philanthropy Australasia (F&P)*, and undertaken research into a number of areas relating to fundraising.

In 2014 she was awarded a Churchill Fellowship to investigate self-regulation and complaints handling in not-for-profit organisations. Three years later she was admitted as a Member of the Order of Australia for 'significant services to the not-for-profit sector, particularly fundraising reform and codes of conduct.' From 2005 she was a member of ACFID's Code of Conduct Committee which she chaired from 2010-2015.

Dr Wallace is currently Vice-President, Humanitarian Quality Assurance Initiative (Geneva); Convenor, Expert Panel on complaints handling by charities; Chair, Customer Owned Banking Association Code Compliance Committee; and Member, Council of the Centre for Social Impact, UNSW.

In addition, Dr Wallace holds the following qualifications: a PhD from the Australian National University; a Graduate Certificate in Management from Monash University; an Advanced Diploma in Arts from the University of New England, a Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours) from the University of Sydney, and a Graduate Diploma in Directorship from the Australia Institute of Company Directors.
