


## Tell Coles and Woolworths: we want BILBIES not BUNNIES next Easter.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I'm writing to ask you to uphold an Aussie tradition and stock chocolate bilbies next Easter.

The past few months have reminded us how fragile our environment and precious our wildlife is. The bilby is one of our native species. It's walked this land for 15 million years, but it's now on the brink of extinction.

Next Easter, Australians will spend billions of dollars on chocolate. In your shops, they're offered countless chocolate bunnies. Why? As a species, the bunny has done terrible damage to our agriculture and environment. Why are you celebrating the bunny when a native species needs your support to survive?

So far you've refused to stock chocolate bilbies from ethical suppliers like Pink Lady. As such you're denying Australian consumers the chance to choose BILBIES not BUNNIES when each purchase would help save the bilby.

You're one of Australia's biggest supermarkets. Unless you stock chocolate bilbies there will be little chance of us being able keep alive the Aussie tradition of the Easter bilby. That choice is being taken from us. And it'll be a severe blow to the bilby's chances of survival.

I feel so strongly about this. Chocolate bilbies—that would contribute directly to saving the bilby
—on sale in your stores at Easter time, and I look forward to hearing from you what your
decision is.





308 feral cats and 93 kittens were removed from outside the fence!!




Over 400 bilbies in our sanctuary at Currawinya!!

Over 60 baby bilbies raised and 1/3 of Australia's captive bilby population held in créching conditions to provide animals for re-introduction across Australia!!








